Letter From The President

Dear CARTA Loyal Community,

The first event allowed us to listen to papers presented by our international colleagues, while the second gave an opportunity to students from several universities and a high school to show their talents in reciting beautiful Russian verses.

Friday, the first Conference Day at the venue, turned out to be really busy. The Board began its work early in the morning. In the afternoon, a group of twenty gathered for a tour of the Woody Guthrie Museum. We were fortunate to have a very artistic and passionate tour guide who recited many known and less known lines from Woody's songs, while offering his personal comments demonstrating the relevance of those works for today's life. From there, the group moved to the Yevgeniy Yevtushenko commemorative bench in Woodward Park, where we raised a Champagne toast to the memory of that great poet. Zhenya Yevtushenko, Junior, then recited his dad's very famous poem «Идут белые снега...».

The day climaxed with an Opening Reception with savory food and drinks, providing a relaxing atmosphere while the guests enjoyed an excellent performance by ECU Showtime and a skit presented by ECU students. The group cheered the bravest who accepted my invitation to dance "Letka-jenka" with me and my students.

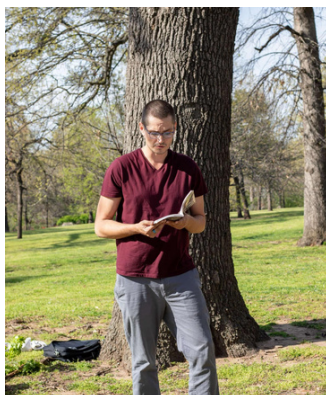

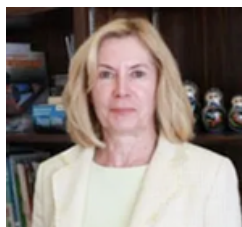

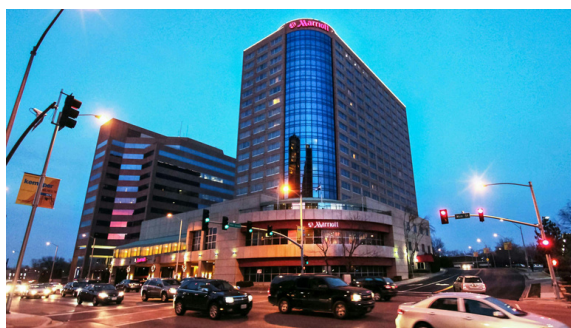

Pre-Conference Workshop/Tour: WALK AROUND the Rock and WALK AROUND the BLOCK



Make Plans to Attend a Pre-Conference Workshop/Tour
on April 4, 2025, Friday, 2:00 p.m. - 4:00 p.m.

Dr. Al Turner will guide a tour featuring a huge malachite taza at the Linda Hall library, followed by a guided walk through the Country Club Plaza. The taza was purportedly gifted to an American ambassador to Russia in 1910 by Czar Nicholas II and was subsequently acquired by the library. It is approximately 6'6" in height and 5' in diameter.



The Plaza opened in 1923 as one of the first outdoor suburban shopping centers in the United States. It encompasses a 14-block area with forty fountains and sculptures. The prevalent Baroque and Moorish Revival architecture is represented in twelve towers, numerous high-end retail establishments, and offices interspersed with sidewalk cafes. The Plaza was named in the Project for Public Spaces list of sixty World's Great Places.

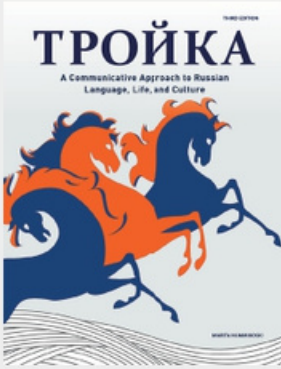

Мы познакомились с Татьяной Философовой на одной из конференций Центральной ассоциации преподавателей русского языка Америки (КАРТА) более десяти лет тому назад. Таня часто выступала на наших конференциях с интересными докладами по методике преподавания русского языка. Она была жизнерадостным, творческим и неутомимым преподавателем, которого обожали студенты и очень ценили и уважали коллеги.

Несмотря на свою большую занятость, она находила время для исследовательской работы, постоянно интересовалась новыми тенденциями в методике преподавания и работала над созданием новых учебных материалов для студентов. Её пособие по грамматике русского языка востребовано как преподавателями, так и студентами во многих университетах США. Оно является большим подспорьем в изучении языка.

Благодаря усилиям Татьяны в университете северного Техаса в течение нескольких лет действовала замечательная программа StarTalk, которой Татьяна также руководила. Эта программа дала возможность многим старшеклассникам начать изучение русского языка.

CARTA Members' News and Accomplishments

Don Dyer, Tamara Karakozova, and Valentina Iepuri received a STARTALK federal grant. The Department of Modern Languages at the University of Mississippi will host the Mississippi Russian STARTALK Pathways program this summer, June 16-27, 2025. The program will provide up to twenty rising high school sophomores and juniors with two weeks of intensive instruction in basic Russian on the campus of the University of Mississippi as well as opportunities outside the classroom to deepen their understanding of Russian culture. Students accepted into the program will receive full funding for participation, which includes housing and meals.

Valentina Iepuri and Don Dyer wrote an article *Languages on the Move: The Linguistic Landscape of Moldova in the Second Decade of the 21st Century*. The article is accepted for publication in the international journal *Slavia Meriodonalis*, vol. 25, Language of Politics, Language in Politics: Discursive, Multimodal, and Virtual Realities.

Valentina Iepuri presented papers at three conferences: CARTA- 2024, The 23rd Biennial Conference on Balkan and South Slavic Linguistics, Literature and Folklore, May 2-4, 2024, Oxford, Mississippi, and at The Central Slavic Conference, virtual session - Nov. 1-3, 2024, Saint Louis, Missouri.

CARTA Members' News and Accomplishments

Michael Long was appointed for a third 3-year term as Chair of the Department of Modern Languages and Cultures at Baylor University. Long coedited—with Julie deGraffenried (Baylor)—a volume of original research articles titled *Freedom of Conscience in (Post)Soviet Space: the Legacy of Michael Bourdeaux and the Keston Archive* (Northern Illinois University Press/Cornell University Press), to be published with a release date in late spring, early summer 2025. Long's article titled "Overcoming One's Own Fear: Exile Publishing, Samizdat, and the Illegal Transport of Literature to Czechoslovakia, 1971-1989," is included in the volume.

Mara Sukholutskaya developed a course that explores rich Russian culture in the USA as its focal point. The major part of the course was a five-day trip that included Slavic sites in Kansas, Missouri, Minnesota, and Oklahoma. The participants learned about the place of the first socialist paper (Girard, KS); admired a spectacular malachite taza in Kansas City, MO; enjoyed late Soviet-time paintings at the Russian Art Museum in Minneapolis and toured a hundred-year-old Cyril and Methody Russian Orthodox church in Hartshorne, Oklahoma. Dining at authentic restaurants was an additional benefit.

The textbook *Russian through Film* (Routledge) that **Irina Six** co-authored with Anna Kudyma and Irina Walsh has received the 2024 AATSEEL Award for Best Book in Second Language Acquisition. Using this textbook, Irina was awarded a CREES grant to develop the online course Russian through Film.

Elena Doshlygina was promoted to Applied Professor of Russian in the School of Language and Literature at the University of Tulsa.

Jill Neuendorf graduated from the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee's Translation and Interpreting Studies Program with a master's degree in translation from Russian to English. She translated four articles for Russian Life, the textbook *The Physics of Planet Earth and Its Natural Wonders* by Dmitry Livanov, and won first place in the Third Annual International Film Translation Contest "Babylon V" in St. Petersburg, Russia.

Alla Kourova published *Bridging Cultures in Business Russian through the Research-Based Approach* and *Journey through the Russian Language: A Comprehensive Reading Textbook*. Two of her students have received Fulbright awards: one is a Fulbright Teaching Assistant in Kazakhstan, and another is a Fulbright Researcher in Kirgizstan.

Iuliia Rychkova has published a co-authored article in the Russian Language Journal on AI-powered writing assignments for intermediate and advanced Russian learners.
